Application assistance available for Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids or other health care programs.

Tarzana Treatment Centers' Benefits Advisors are Certified Application Assistant (CAA's) and can help you through the difficult and confusing process of applying for and retaining benefits with various health insurance programs. They can help you apply for Medi-Cal, Healthy Families, Healthy Kids or other health care programs that will best meet the needs of you and your family.

We are currently working with community agencies, clinics, schools, churches/temples, community centers, parent centers, WIC, Head Start and other community partners to screen families for healthcare coverage. Representatives are available to provide assistance to working parents by appointment.

To apply, you must bring the following:

- 1. Children's birth certificates
- 2. Children's Social Security cards
- 3. Proof of income with most recent paycheck stub
- 4. Proof of address (telephone, gas or utility bill)
- 5. Proof of pregnancy (if applicable)
- 6. Car registration (if applicable)








Free & Low-cost Health Care ... for you and your family





What Kind of Health Care Programs Are Available?

There are many healthcare programs for which you and your children may qualify. Some are free or low cost.

Why Do You And Your Children Need Health Care Coverage?

- Through health care coverage you will have access to a medical provider and access to routine medical check-ups that can help you and your family better prevent and detect any chronic health condition.
- Chronic diseases such as diabetes, asthma, high blood pressure, heart disease, and HIV/ AIDS are best managed and treated via regular contact with your medical provider versus waiting until it is necessary to visit the Emergency Room.
- For children, the lack of health care coverage may affect their learning and ability to do well in school.
- With healthcare coverage, you and your children are generally covered for medical, dental, mental healthand vision care, including glasses and prescription medications.
- Healthcare problems found and treated early are easier to correct, save you money, and may be prevented from becoming a serious problem or an emergency.
- It is much easier to get medical treatment for your sick or injured children, if you have health care coverage.

Medi-Cal

Medi-Cal for children provides no-cost or low-cost comprehensive medical and vision care coverage for children (0-21 years old) and pregnant women. Eligibility is determined by family size, children's ages, and family income. This program is available to eligible U.S. citizens, nationals or immigrants. Non-citizen children who do not qualify for free Medi-Cal can apply for Emergency Medi-Cal.

Medicare Patients Welcome

We now provide family medical services under the Medicare Payer Source Program.

Healthy Families

Healthy Families is a low cost insurance program that provides medical, dental and vision coverage for children and teens (age 0-19), who are not insured and are not eligible for no-cost Medi-Cal or have high share of cost (SOC) Medi-Cal. Monthly premiums are very reasonable with a maximum low dollar amount per family. Eligibility for the program is determined by the size of the family, children's ages, and family income. To qualify for Health Families, the family's income must be greater than that required by Medi-Cal.

Healthy Kids

Healthy Kids provides no-cost or low-cost comprehensive medical and vision care coverage for children (0-18 years old). Fees can be as low as zero and depend on your family's income and the number of children in your household. Your children could qualify even if you work full-time.



A New Service is now available Integrated Telehealth Services for Individuals and Families

The convenience of telemedicine at our primary care clinic, using the MDLiveVisit interface, is a helpful service for many of our patients. You can meet with a physician by video conference using a computer with a webcam from your home or office. Some follow-up visits that simply involve answering some questions can even be completed over the phone.

Secure E-mail Advice

This provides savings for our patients in travel costs and time. Sessions are recorded so physicians can review them later, and they can see all of your medical records. You can even link your MDLiveVisit health records to Google Health so you can access them anywhere. After your first telemedicine session, you can use the service for health care needs that don't require face-to-face sessions.

More Health Care Programs

If your children do not qualify for Medi-Cal If your children do not qualify for Medi-Cal or Healthy Families, there are other programs available, which they may qualify for such as Child Health and Disability Prevention Program (CHDP) and Kaiser Child Health Plan.

Non-citizen children can also obtain medical, dental, and vision care through Healthy Kids and Kaiser Child Health Plan.

There are also programs available for adults and children in Los Angeles County such as Public Private Partnership (PPP), Ability to Pay Plan (ATP) and Outpatient Reduced-Cost Simplified Application (ORSA). PPP offers primary care services such as doctor's visits, medication, x-rays and laboratory services free of charge. ATP and ORSA are programs that allows families who cannot afford the cost of their healthcare to get healthcare at County hospitals and clinics at no cost or low cost.
